This Risk Assessment relates to work activity to the Steam Museum Covid-19 response for 2022, and should be used in addition to the existing work activity risk assessments already in place.

Public Health England (PHE) recommends that the following general cold and flu precautions are taken to help prevent people from catching and spreading COVID-19: Staff should not attend the workplace; and get a polymerase chain reaction PCR test as soon as possible, if they or anyone they live with have any of the symptoms of Covid-19:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough
- a loss of, or change to, your sense of smell or taste

If staff have cold symptoms or generally feel unwell they should also stay or work at home rather and not come into the office. Staff should order a PCR test kit to be sent to their home or book an appointment at a walk-in or drive-through test site.

Staff are to follow PHE advice on testing, self-isolation and managing confirmed cases.

If staff do not have symptoms and are at work they should:

- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze Catch it, Bin it, Kill it
- Put used tissues in the bin straight away
- Wash your hands with soap and water often use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available.
- Maintain social distancing
- Avoid close contact with people who are unwell
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces
- Do not touch your eyes, nose or mouth if your hands are not clean.
